- > get rid of, probably under networking devices.
- > Be sure to look at the bottom for yellow question marks, "unknown" devices.
- > These might be partially installed.
- > I would uninstall and delete all of the one you don't want, and maybe the
- > one you do want, reboot with both devices removed, and start over.
